CALGARY CHAPTER 2019 STUDENT AWARD

Deadline for Application: March 31, 2019

DESCRIPTION OF AWARD: The Calgary Chapter of the Alberta Association on Gerontology (CC-AAG) is pleased to be the sponsor of an award to be given to a student from the Calgary area who has an interest in any aspect of aging. The award is expected to assist with the costs associated with a student's coursework, research or attendance at a workshop or conference.

VALUE AND DURATION: An award of \$1,000 will be awarded annually. The award recipient will also receive a free one-year membership in the Alberta Association on Gerontology.

ELIGIBILITY: The applicant must:

1. Reside in Calgary or surrounding area.
2. Be registered in a graduate degree program in an accredited post-secondary institution in Alberta
3. Not be in the last term of their program
4. Demonstrate an interest in any aspect of aging
5. Agree to contribute an article for an edition of the AAGMag (e.g., a written summary of planned research).

Individuals are encouraged to apply for the AAG Provincial award as well as the AAG Calgary Chapter award but more than one award will not be given to the same person in the same year. An individual can receive the Calgary Chapter award only once in their degree/diploma studies program.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE: A complete application will consist of five parts:

1. A two-page cover letter that includes a description of the applicant's current studies or research, relevant volunteer/work experience, future plans in gerontology (academic, research, practice), and a brief statement of how the award will be used to support the applicant's interest in gerontology.
2. A completed application form (see next page).
3. A copy of the applicant's curriculum vitae.
4. A copy of all post-secondary education transcripts (they do not need to be original).
5. A letter of reference on institutional letterhead from the student's supervisor. This letter should indicate the student's name in the header and must be submitted directly by the supervisor to AAG either by email or mail (see below for address).

SELECTION PROCESS: This award will be adjudicated/administered by the Alberta Association on Gerontology Provincial Board.

CRITERIA: Applications will be assessed on academic merit as illustrated by grades and educational attainment, relevant work/volunteer experience, current studies/research plans, future commitment to the field of gerontology, and an indication of how this award will be used to support the applicant's interest in gerontology. Preference will be given to full-time students and current AAG members.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: March 31, 2019 (post-marked or e-mail). The award will be presented at the Annual General Meeting in June.
